The Palace of Nanyue Kingdom - “Wan Sui” Eaves Tile Rubbing Workshop

The excavated remains of the Site of the Palace of the Nanyue Kingdom included the palace and garden ponds of the Nanyue Kingdom in the Western Han, and of others dating from the Southern Han Kingdom during the Five Dynasties and Ten Kingdoms period. The “Wan Sui” eaves tiles, symbolising auspiciousness and longevity, were also unearthed at the site. This workshop will give an introduction of the “Wan Sui” eaves tiles and record the pattern of the eave tile with you through rubbing.
